If the child is under 10, they need a 'side-walker' to walk around with them. If the child is under 5 the 'side-walker' needs to be in physical contact with the rider. Riders cannot ride in trainers due to Health and Safety. If they have any boots [wellies are ideal] they should wear them. Alternatively, we have numerous and various boots you can loan free of charge on the day. Side-walkers are allowed to wear trainers or any type of closed in shoe. Any form of sandal, flip-flop or slider is not permitted.







We do not usually inform your parents, teachers or anyone else if you contact the school nurse. We might inform someone if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps).
