Coronavirus (Covid-19) Keeping you in touch



- This is a slide-based briefing which should be cascaded to all staff through line management chains and shared / <u>discussed with all those who are not</u> <u>on email at weekly or daily briefings</u>. It is issued to Managers at least 2x per week on Tuesday and Thursday, or more frequently as required.

National and local status



The number of infections continues to grow, as of 4.40pm on 10 June 2020:

- 290,143 cases of coronavirus have been confirmed.
- There have been **41,128 deaths** in the UK.
- Newham has 1,005 confirmed cases.
- We have had to reduce many council services to support social distancing or due to lack of staff.



Key updates for staff 11/06/2020



- Two groups of people were advised to stay at home when lockdown commenced:
 - People who are clinically extremely vulnerable often described as "shielding"
 - People are clinically vulnerable often described as having underlying health conditions
- People who are shielding are strongly advised by the government to stay at home as much as
 possible and to keep time spent outside to a minimum.
- People who are clinically vulnerable were initially told stay at home for 12 weeks. The latest
 government guidance is that, while people in this category should stay at home as much as possible,
 they can leave home (including to go to work) so long as they stringently observe social distancing.
- This means that **employees who are clinically vulnerable could soon be asked to return to the workplace**, so long as:
 - the employee's workplace has been made "Covid-19 secure"
 - all relevant health and safety measures, including risk assessments and training, are in place
 - the employee's job role cannot be undertaken effectively from home
 - a "reintroduction to the workplace" meeting is held with the employee upon their return
- **Further guidance on these employees will follow**. Managers will contact employees in this category to explain the information set out above and ensure that if required they are prepared for a potential return to the workplace.
- Our approach has not changed in relation to employees that are shielding; managers should not ask employees who are shielding to attend their place of work.
- Employees shielding should work from home wherever possible.

Return to work reminder: 11/06/2020



- In effort to make our buildings Covid secure a number of changes have been implemented.
 - New signage in buildings.
- Some of the **desks have been closed off** to maintain social distancing with red transparent covers on chairs and notices stating that the desk is not to be used.
 - There are **floor markings** to help guide people through particular **one-way** circulation routes.
 - Only **one person is allowed in a lift** at any one time.
 - Entry and exit routes to the building have been re-engineered to keep you safe.
 - There are **new cleaning regimes** and we have improved access to sanitizers and wipes.
- Operational desks are set up to be used with the new Smarter Newham devices if you don't have a
 device and you need to come into the office you can request one from
 Smarternewham@newham.gov.uk
- The use of face coverings on public transport is mandatory from 15 June so please ensure that you
 are equipped.
- With some people returning to on site working, and advice to avoid public transport if possible, now
 is a great time to consider cycling to work. The Cycle to Work scheme enables you to save money on
 a new bike and accessories while spreading the cost over 12 months.
- The scheme is open to permanent employees and employees on a fixed term contract with at least
 12 months remaining. For more information www.cyclescheme.co.uk.

General updates for staff 11/06/2020



- Staff are reminded that if you need advice or support, please ask for help at any time. You can also contact hr@newham.gov.uk and ask for a chat with a Mental Health First Aider.
- Testing for Covid-19 is available in Newham, with fixed and mobile site options for booking.
- The **test must be taken within the first 5 days of symptoms,** therefore is unsuitable for people who have self-isolated longer than 5 days.


