PROPOSED REVISIONS TO PARKING PERMITS IN NEWHAM CONTROLLED PARKING ZONES

The Newham (Parking Places) (Amendments to Permits) Order 2020

- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Newham proposes to make the Newham (Parking Places) (Amendments to Permits) Order 2020 under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order would be to further amend all Newham parking places Orders which include reference to permits so as to:-
 - introduce virtual (paperless) permits managed in a 'parking wallet' for each household or business which would replace all paper permits, including resident visitor permits, except for carer permits (which will remain as paper permits);
 - (ii) introduce emissions-based charging for business and industrial parking permits;
 - (iii) introduce an emissions-based charging element for resident permits in addition to the current household permit charges;
 - (iv) change the current 10 hour resident visitor permits so that they would now be valid for 12 hours;
 - (v) introduce a free 2 hour monthly parking allocation for each household to allow resident permit holders to park in any permit holder or shared-use bay in any controlled parking zone. The monthly household allocation could be used in 15 minute intervals and would be a pro-rata allocation of the total time across the number of permits per household (e.g. 2 hours for a single permit holder, 1 hour each if 2 permit holders etc.);
 - (vi) introduce discounted business permits for Newham based charities that require the use of vehicles to undertake visits to premises (other than their registered charity address) within the borough; and
 - (vii) revise permit charges as detailed in paragraphs 3 to 6 below.
