Believing in young people

What is it?

- 10 week Youth Work programme in 6 schools
- Directly address youth violence and value of their life
- Led by **their** experiences, **their** story, **their** voice
- Youth Work with 60 YP 'influencers'
- A 'reachable moment'
- Empower the 60 to influence thinking of 1000* YP
- YP lead own workshop/presentation to peers, show emergency first aid

Why Fund This?

- Loss of life/potential in CT/CH
- Solution involves YP (their decision to carry a knife/retaliate/joint enterprise)
- Not about getting YP off the streets but YP reclaiming them
- Developed by YP for YP
- Home Office backed
- Involves community, faith groups and local agencies
- Proven to have saved at least 1 YP (knew what to do when stabbed)
- Piloted 2019 in Royal Docks by local Youth Workers change story in CT/CH
