


Vaccination coverage (to 26th Jan 2022)

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases fell this week with 2,292 cases. Testing also decreased.

241,528 first doses, 214,048 second doses, and 121,762 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 2nd Feb).

Case rates are falling in Newham and nationally but please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
