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Housing conditions criteria

(sources: LBN data warehouse, English IMD, and LBN GIS team)

- Within Newham, areas with high percentages of Late Victorian/ Edwardian homes built between 1870 and 1914 are extremely more likely to have high rates of hazards in the home in the Private Rented Sector.
- PRS households in the most income deprived 20% nationally are almost 3 times more likely to have hazards in the home (28%, compared with 10% of all houses nationally).

Build age criteria: met if >20% late Victorian/Edwardian (1870-1914) **Income criteria**: met if any neighbourhood within the borough is within the bottom 20% of income deprivation
