NewDAy School and Learning supports your child to improve their life at school so they can achieve their education potential.

What to expect?

NewDAy advisory teachers work with the teaching staff at your child's school to put a spotlight on their learning. Their aim is to ensure school is a place where children feel safe and happy, and can focus on education.

An advisory teacher can meet your child to find out what school is like for them, what's going well and what might help. If parents need help or advice with anything to do with school, they can receive help too.

NewDAy also offers school staff training to understand how domestic abuse impacts children

Course details

Three terms of support with one-to-one work where appropriate.

Who is it for?

NewDAy School and Learning is for children aged 2-17 who have experienced or witnessed domestic abuse – where there is an education related concern.

How does it help?

NewDAy School and Learning:

- champions the educational needs of children to help improve attendance, learning and daily life at school
- enables communication between parents/carers, the school and professionals
- supports school staff to understand how domestic abuse can impact on children's life at school.

Who can refer?

Teaching staff, Social Workers or Families First Workers

What are the referral criteria?

Any child approaching school age i.e. aged 2-5, or aged 5-17 if they attend a Newham school or college.

Professionals should gain parental consent when making a referral.
