Mayor of Newham election results: ROKHSANA FIAZ statement

29 percent of voters turned out for yesterday's election. 4 years ago it was 36 percent.

In London, the turnout was similarly low.

Our people are focused on the day-to-day struggles in the face of the Tories cost of living crisis that is forcing our residents to make the toughest of choices: whether to heat their homes or feed their children.

They are struggling to pay their bills and risk losing their homes as interest rates spiral.

They haven't turned their back on politics, but rather given up because of the shameful behaviour of national Tory politicians including the Prime Minister.

He should go now for the sake of our country.

Here in Newham, this election has been marred by the shameful behaviour of anonymous campaigners who have targeted my Labour candidates because they are women, or from our LGBT+ community. They have used religion as a weapon to divide our communities.

It is hateful, and the full force of the law should be marshalled to identify the criminals.

The politics of hate has no place in Newham.

We must reject it.

The diversity of our people is our strength.

And our borough is a place for everyone.
