# Newham High Streets Programme Phase 1: Green Street Project Delivery Tracker

#### **Summer 2022**

The Newham High Street Programme launched in September 2020.

The Newham High Streets Phase 1 Report was published in June 2021 and included the **Green Street High Street Delivery Plan (PDF)**.

The Delivery Plan was developed through a community co-design process and incorporates project ideas suggested by local residents and businesses.

The tables below provide an update on the progress made in progressing some of the project recommendations after one year since the publication of the Delivery Plan. The Council has focused on progressing the ideas that were most popular with local communities during community engagement.

>Green Street Library Relocation	Green Street library is the smallest one in Newham. The Council is assessing the opportunities for a new library and community centre as part of the future options study for Queens Market and Hamara Ghar.	The Queen's Market and Hamara Ghar Investment Strategy Study is in progress and will consider options for future investment in this strategic site, which could include the provision of space for a new library.

>Evening Pop Up	Organise pop-up events and activities that can extend the town centre's activity into the evening.	In July 2022 the Council submitted an application to the Greater London Authority to make a bid for a Green Street Night Time Enterprise Zone. If successful the funding would support extending evening opening hours and evening events including; cultural, fashion, jewellery, bridal as well as to tackle crime and ASB.

# Recommendation K. Improve the variety of uses on Green Street, provide better food options and service people with varying disposable income

>Uses control	Address residents' concerns with regards to the abundance of betting shops and takeaways in high streets.	There have been no permissions for new betting shops or hot food takeaways. These types of business remain subject to planning control under Use Classes Legislation.
