
EMERGING CONTEXT

The map below is a compilation of existing and ongoing masterplans and land designation across the borough. These work streams have worked with this characterisation study and there is alignment in the work which will be shaping the future of the borough.

The 5 existing masterplans and designations include:

- Royal Docks OAPF: Join the Docks (2019) report and appendices; Vision AND Principles consultation summary (2020)
- · Royal Docks Enterprise Zone
- London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC): the LLDC is transitioning back to LB Newham in 2024 and will be included in the new Local Plan.





HERITAGE + LANDMARKS

Newham has a rich heritage validated by its array of Statutory and Locally Listed Buildings, Scheduled Monuments, Historic Parks and Gardens, Archaeological Priority Areas and Conservation Areas. Typically, many of these include churches and significant civic buildings of architectural quality. More uniquely to Newham, many of the protected buildings and areas are located on northern and western edges of the borough and include many industrial heritage buildings in the Royal Docks. This is in recognition of Newham's unique role in the development of London, as one of the industrial centres during the industrial revolution.
