We consider that the inspections undertaken by the Council of licensed premises to be as a part of the regulatory powers conferred on the authority to ensure compliance with the law and the licences which has been issued for these premises and to determine as to whether any further enforcement action should be taken by the authority to respect of these licenses. To this effect we believe it is in the public interest that the Council is able to conduct its investigations independently and in the exercise of these functions, such information relevant to those investigations should not be released into the public domain. We consider that disclosure of the information will inhibit the Council's ability to conduct its investigations in a fair, thorough and effective manner. Therefore, under the exemptions quoted above, we maintain it is in the public's interest not to release the information requested as it could adversely prejudice the conduct of any pending or future investigations and/or prosecutions of any inspections carried out during the requested time period if the requested information were released into the public domain.
