2 August 22	Any other football related business <u>Traffic calming measures on the North South Highway</u> A separate meeting will be held between LLDC, LAS, SJA, WHUFC & LS185 facilitated by LBN, to review and discuss in detail the traffic calming measures in place around the stadium. <i>Initial and follow up meeting has taken place.</i>	
7 Feb 23	<b>Update</b> PT (LLDC) confirmed that all speed bumps have been removed and a new scheme will be designed and shared with partners for comment. The proposed removal of a limited number of the speed humps as an interim measure was not effective. Some increase in speeding has been reported by school parents. PT to feedback on alternative traffic calming measures being considered. SR raised concern that the remedial works should be instigated as soon as is possible.	)
	WHUFC to mention to players leaving post-match that dangerous driving / speed has been reported by residents.	
13 July 23	<u>Update</u> 1. Traffic Calming measures - no further updates, still with planning and details shared with SAG once finalised.	TT (LLDC)

	3. High-end vehicles observed racing down Cooks Road and Barbers Road on non-event days, LLDC are working on tackling this.	
7 Feb 23	SGSA update and match day observations SGSA acknowledged the continuing improvement with the management of persistent standing, although promote investigating the viability of safer standing rails in the lowers particularly in home areas. The Stadium is licenced as an 'All Seater Stadium' and therefore is currently not compliant.	
2 May 23	<u>Update</u> SGSA remain concerned about persistent standing in the lower tiers and reiterated that the Stadium is only licensed as an 'All Seater Stadium' and a solution to mitigate persistent standing and migration needs to be implemented by LS185.	
	It was agreed that there is still work to be done ensuring fans remain seated in both the home and away lower tiers. <b>LS185 to continue working with</b> <b>WHUFC on messaging and mitigation strategies.</b> SJA added that rails in	



23 Jul 23	the lowers would not leave sufficient space between the rail and seating to carry out any emergency procedures. <b>Update</b> There is ongoing work and meetings between SGSA and LS185 to consider these concerns and agree mitigation actions. SGSA added they would be taking more of an enforcement stance going forward. Building Control will be consulted.		
2 May 23	<b>Ejections on banning list</b> LS185 and the club investigate the source of the tickets of all fans ejected and if found to be purchased from an unauthorised agency then details are shared with the league and appropriate action taken. <b>WHUFC to confirm if</b> <b>these have been included on the banning list.</b>		
13 July 23	<u>Update</u> BI (WHUFC) confirmed that there are penalties for breaking of ground regulations, seat migration and misuse of tickets. Once an investigation has been concluded and particulars of ejection established, WHUFC arrange the appropriate ban. SR (LBN) requested an up to date banning list indicating those resultant from an ejection.

PS (LS185) announced that WHUFC at the London Stadium has the highest arrest record in the League, which is evident of the good in-house processes and strong partnership working.		
GA (TFL) will reach out to DLR colleagues, to report in real time to SOR.		
Transport partners to share data with the MPS and BTP. WHUFC will review any data from PML and NTH and reiterated that good evidence is required to issue the appropriate ban.		
Bodycams are encouraged for data collection. CD (DLR) stated that body worn cameras will be in place from the first fixture of the new 2023-2024 season and CCTV is available to review. Bodycams are widely used at Stratford Regional. LS185 to share the contact number for reporting on the day with CD (DLR).	PS	
5. End of season report (LS185, SGSA, MPS, WHUFC)		
<u>MPS</u> MPS shared their summary of 2022-2023 West Ham United Football fixtures at the London Stadium. There have been 27 1 <sup>st</sup> team fixtures policed at the Stadium plus one U18 FA cup Semi Final.		
2022-2023 saw an increase in arrests for both home and away because of the proactive approach taken by partners and the package in place. Coach parking is working well.		
WHUFC are back in Europe for 2023-2023 season and the draw will take place on the 1 <sup>st</sup> September.		
Police would like to target youth restorative work and youth engagement piece for the new season.		
LS185 LS185 thanked stakeholders for their continued support and engagement.		
<u>SGSA</u> LE thanked all present and added that the police and LS185 had performed incredibly well. There has been obvious improvements made all around, with persistent standing remaining a work in progress.		
<u>WHUFC</u> Great season with the European win. Stewarding is improving and West Ham FC thanked partners for their continue support with excellent cooperation from the stadium. WHFC are proud of the proactive action taken at the stadium.		
<u>LBN – Certifying Authority</u> 2022-2023 season has been a success despite all the pressures on LS185. Delivery and planning has been excellent with policing running smoothly and increased steward confidence.		
7. Platform 13 update		
LBN to organise a TAG (Transport Advisory Group) meeting to discuss and review the operational plan for Platform 13. It was noted that TFL are unable to manage the route without additional intervention. SGSA recommend and support closure during egress.	АТ	
8. Safety related issues raised by fan groups		
<u>Height of the west stand wall</u> LS185 confirmed that the wall works well in preventing seat migration, which has been raised as a concern by the SGSA. CCTV is used proactively and forms part of the overall enhancement strategy. No specific concerns or issues noted.
