If you're in financial crisis, freecall 0808 2082138 (open Mon to Fri, 9am-5pm) to talk confidentially to a trained Citizens Advice adviser. They will provide support to help you manage your money, navigate the benefits system, and identify any other grants you might be entitled to. If you need one, they'll issue you with a food bank voucher so you can get an emergency food parcel.




As you arrive, there will be refreshments and a beautiful exhibition of artwork by Praxis members from the past year for you to check out.



Alternatives Trust	Courses in our Centre's 'Learning Hub' – a boardroom with a screen and donated laptops to fill basic skills gaps that prevent women from finding work or studying in the UK. They aim to help women be ready to find work when they have the immigration status that allows them to do so.
Bonny Downs Community Association	Family Hub project welcomes all refugee/ migrants/asylum seekers parents in Newham with dependent children who are struggling to raise family on their families on very low incomes and/or without the support network of extended family nearby.
