Dynamic Purchasing Vehicle	It is an electronic system for the Council to buy services. The Council sets standards that the providers/suppliers must demonstrate when they apply to join. Providers /supplier must be approved before the Council will use them.
Dynamic Support Register DSR	The DSR is a list of people with learning disabilities and/or autism who at risk of being admitted to a specialist or mental health hospital. Health and Social Care meet every fortnight to review the list and make sure that the right support is in place to keep people out of hospital.

Elective Care	This is a planned medical treatment. It is not emergency treatment.

Support Or PBS	It looks at behaviour from the person's point of view.	
	Good PBS should increase the quality of life and decrease 'problem' behaviour by teaching new skills and making changes to a person's environment.	
PMLD	This can be used to describe people who have Profound and Multiple Learning Disabilities.	
Provider / family breakdown	This is when a person has to move because the placement or family home cannot meet their needs.	
	Sometimes this is because of the environment, sometimes it is due to not having the right support.

Social Prescribing	Social prescribing refers to when health professionals refer patients to non-clinical support services in the local community to help their health and wellbeing where appropriate.	
STAMP	Supporting Treatment and Appropriate Medication in Paediatrics is a national programme that aims to make sure that children and families can access other treatment and support when children display behaviours that challenge (including accessing medication if they need it). This is for children and young people with a learning disability, autism or both.	

STOMP	Stopping over medication of people with learning disabilities, autism or both is a national programme aims to stop the overuse of psychotropic medications. This is for adults with a learning disability, autism or both.			
STOMP-inclusive Structured Medication Review template	This is used by a Specialist Chemist to check if medication can be reduced.			
Substance Misuse	This is where a person uses alcohol or illegal drugs in a dangerous way. People First have a lot of good information on their website.			
Supported Living Dynamic Purchasing Vehicle	This is a process the Council uses to buy services. Providers have to apply to this and tell the Council why they can provide a good service.
