**Benefits:** This project will increase and enhance green spaces in Forest Gate, will bring the community together and has the potential to reduce environmental crime

**Project description:** This package includes everything in the standard *Greening and Gardening* package plus additional elements to help enhance the program including:

- Additional budget for a scheme which helps and supports residents who cannot manage overhanging gardens and greenery themselves
- Additional investment in pocket parks
- Additional investment in adoption of raised beds and troughs

**Benefits:** This project will increase and enhance green spaces in Forest Gate, will assist those who need help with greening and will bring the community together with the potential to reduce environmental crime
