Priority 1 - Community Safety and Cohesion – Anti Social Behaviour

- 1. A project around engaging rough sleeping community- collaborative approach and understanding their challenges to provide support (local groups, faith groups, charities, businesses, Police, LBN teams)
- 2. Tenants Information Packs Landlords purchase information pack produced by LBN. This can be funded through local businesses, new developers and advertising

Through licensing, it should be mandatory for landlords to provide information pack

4. Assess the problem and arrange a walk with local residents, businesses and cleansing team

Priority 2: Environment Concerns (Litter, Fly tipping) Including Parks and Green Spaces

- 1. Designated Area for bulky waste collection from blocks of flats
- OR Bulky Waste Collection Day

3. Large bin areas or more bins in Stratford and West ham

4. <u>Greet Your Street Cleaner</u> - Pilot an area for raising profile of street Cleaners and waste management staff through media campaign (Interviews, photos, Posters, publications, social media). The Mayor does street cleaning shift and discuss experiences in Newham Mag. An event to celebrate the cleaners (Picnic in Stratford Park) or event in Town Hall), this could be amalgamated with Community Builders Event.

5. <u>Create some notices</u> - Put notices around the borough to make the community aware that it is illegal to spit or urinate

6. <u>Booking the parks</u> - This could be made easier as it is very long winded which puts groups off using the park. Online booking system with a 5 day service response.

Priority 3: Community Development and culture

- Easy to understand website
- Directory of all the community group in Newham which is accessible online so that it is easier for everyone
- Joint up services and activities
- Pay attention to changing demographics
- Use people's stories in Newham Mag and all the good work done by communities which will encourage others and also it raises awareness of community groups





What's been achieved so far?

- **This community plan** that we've just completed has been the result of over 6-7 months of collaborative effort between local people and the council.
- Since September 2018 a new culture of participation is gradually taking root
- By the end of March over 40 assembly events will have taken place.
- They have demonstrated how local people can discuss and put forward proposals in a **harmonious and constructive** way.
- Newham's Assemblies are also giving a voice to The Youth, The Deaf Community and Disabled People.





What's been achieved so far?

- The **People's Budget Forum** has seen the beginning of bringing local people into helping the council make budget decisions.
- The **Our Streets Transport and Parking** engagement brought the digital democracy platform (Polis) together with Forum events to work on complex issues in a civil and constructive way.
- The council is listening and with the help of residents we can get better results together
