East Ham Community Assembly What's been achieved so far?

- **This community plan** that we've just completed has been the result of over 6-7 months of collaborative effort between local people and the council.
- Since September 2018 a new culture of participation is gradually taking root
- By the end of March over **40** assembly events will have taken place.
- They have demonstrated how local people can discuss and put forward proposals in a **harmonious and constructive** way
- Newham's Assemblies are also giving a voice to The Youth, The Deaf Community and Disabled People.





What's been achieved so far?

- **The People's Budget Forum** has seen the beginning of bringing local people into helping the council make budget decisions.
- The **Our Streets Transport and Parking** engagement brought the digital democracy platform (Polis) together with Forum events to work on complex issues in a civil and constructive way.
- The council is listening and with the help of residents we can get better results together
- So the next round is about **your feedback**. What do you think has been positive? What needs to be improved?

I found out from a lady when i was shopping More support at the assembly for people with English requirements I was originally sceptical but it has been very good I regret that i didn't know about the previous assemblies and that i missed them Things do not feel connected and I feel that it could be better in terms of connecting things the borough does a lot and how do you stop people riding bikes on pavements and littering - there feels like a air of depression Enjoyed the experince A great idea It is difficult for people with ESOL needs to understand process, it is very fast and a lot to take in It wasn't clear that we could just turn up More people need to get involved The publicity wasn't clear, until I spoke to Anna I didn't understand what we were doing at the assembly
