Round 2 - What are the outcomes we would like to see happen in Plaistow for 'Flytipping, Cleansing and **Recycling'?**

Cleaner Plaistow Front Gardens are more People more aware and responsible on disposing their beautified and more residents are taking care of their own litter front areas A pedestrianised Alleyway to Cave Road Residents are taking responsibility and sweeping their own front yards and are reporting more of an improvement on their street cleansing Residents are reporting more of a sense of community Recycling stats to improve Landlord/HMO Licencing demonstrates that there has been an improvement on how locally so that more frequent properties are maintained recycling collections are made Pavement and road repairs are completed within a clear timescale, eg 14 days

Pavements are fit for purpose, suitable materials are used ie is tarmac more effective than paving slabs

Better reporting functions for flytipping

increased options to survey and investigate flytipping eg portable CCTV cameras

more residents will be aware of necessity to live in a clean environment, regular programme of education for residents which stresses importance of green and pleasant environment and has a stick element.
