East Ham Arts Festival took place from 26th-30th July 2018.

East Ham Town Hall Every Wednesday 6-7:30pm £2 per person



This started as a free session funded by Sport England for an initial start up period. Due to popularity a small charge was introduced in order to sustain the activity when funding ran out. This group is now attended by up to 30 residents each week and the money collected pays for the instructor and the hall hire.
