Where does our income come from?

- The Council receives £1.05bn in total income
- However a large chunk (over 60%) of this covers specific areas:
 - Schools £268m, Council Housing £111m, Housing Benefit £259m
- Leaves £414m to fund other expenditure.
- £154m of this funding is from fees & charges, specific grants from government and income we get from our assets, including investments.


