Run Director – Central Park Junior Park Run

Front of House Ambassador – Renewal Programme

The Renewal Programme is a well-established and respected local charity based in the London Borough of Newham. We support those who are facing multiple challenges - they might be a migrant or refugee without access to public funds, suffering with homelessness, experiencing poverty, or unable to communicate in English.



Our community hub in Manor Park is a busy facility where we provide a range of opportunities for growth, connection and development for the whole local community. We run adult education class, advice and support sessions, a busy biweekly foodbank, a hot meals service, and much more.

In your role you will support our reception staff to welcome service users to our Food Bank and Hot meals services at our busiest time. You will act as an ambassador for the Renewal Programme, welcoming service users, assisting the receptionist with managing the flow of people and the sign-in system and ensuring that people receive a great customer service experience.

Volunteer tasks include:

- Welcoming service users to the Centre
- Assisting service users with the digital sign in system
- Working closely with the reception team to ensure the flow of visitors is managed safely and efficiently
- Monitor the queuing system and prioritise
 /support users with impaired mobility or young children
- Answer queries.






My Life Exhibition


A new exhibition celebrates the unique and extraordinary stories of twelve artists from around the world that have come to the UK as refugees and asylum seekers.




Residents are welcome to visit the exhibition, engage with the artwork and gain insights into the memories, challenges and hopes of the artists.


