

2025/26 Council Tax **Reduction (CTR) Scheme**

Effective from 1 April 2025



Key Details

Maximum Award:

- Working Age Up to 80% of your bill. Minimum payment is 20%
- Pension age Up to 100% of bill
- Capital Limit:
 - Working age: No CTR if capital exceeds £6,000 (unless receiving certain DWP disability benefits; limit increases to £16,000).

2025/26 Council Tax Reduction (CTR) Scheme

Definition

Capital Limit

The maximum amount of savings or assets you can hold while still qualifying for the Council Tax Reduction Scheme.

Non-Dependants

Adults who live in your household but are not financially dependent on you, such as grown children or extended family members.

Income related benefits

A deduction is not made for other adults living in your household where they are receiving State Pension Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseekers Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, or Universal Credit on the basis that they do not have an earned income.
