Learning Disability report

Ruth presented a report.



The NHS in North East London wrote a report called a Health Needs Assesment.



It covers Hackney, Newham, Tower Hamlets and the City of London. Different people were asked about what they thought, including people with learning disabilities.

The report found that number of people with learning disabilities in North East London is getting bigger.




People come from many different cultures.

They are more likely to have health conditions such as heart disease, diabetes and epilepsy.

They can also feel sad and worried, be lonely and bored and not have access to the internet.





People with learning disabilities in North East London may miss vaccinations for disesases like COVID and Flu. COVID was also hard for people with learning disabilities.

They may be missing out on cancer screenings.

Or may be given medication for mental health problems that they don't actually need.

They may also find it difficult to get a paid job.

They need more help and support to move out of the family home, live independently and attend college.


They can have trouble moving from child to adult servives.

These include planning more for people in North East London, working together to help people with their health and better annual health checks with doctors.

Some people used to get reminders by text messages.

There is a new nurse from the Learning Disabilities Health Team leading on Health Checks.

Sometimes information is missing from the GP records. Or people don't have a learning disability diagnosis.
