

1. Current Facility Limitations

Our existing facilities are not sufficient for meeting the everyday needs of our community. The outdated structure is too small to accommodate all members, particularly women and children, leading to overcrowded conditions. This lack of space limits participation and inclusivity, affecting our community's ability to come together effectively.

2. Importance of an Adequate Replacement Facility

To overcome the current limitations, any new facility must be designed to meet the needs of our growing congregation. Simply replicating the size of the existing facility will not solve these problems. It is essential to conduct a thorough needs assessment to determine the appropriate size and features of the new facility to ensure it is functional and inclusive.

3. Impact on Community Cohesion

The inadequacies of our current facility have driven many worshippers to seek alternative locations for their religious practices, which fragments our community and weakens our collective spirit. A new facility should provide sufficient space to enhance community unity and foster a stronger sense of belonging.

4. Reflecting Diversity in Design

Newham is a diverse borough, and this diversity should be reflected in the
infrastructure plans. The draft proposal needs to incorporate features that
accommodate and celebrate our community's various cultural and religious practices
Designing adaptable and welcoming spaces is crucial to meeting the needs of our
diverse population.

6. 1. Collaboration with Landowners and Authorities

Our community is enthusiastic about working closely with landowners and relevant authorities to develop a replacement facility that genuinely addresses our needs. We believe that a collaborative approach will enable us to find a solution that is advantageous for everyone involved. We propose the formation of a working group or regular consultations to ensure ongoing communication and incorporate diverse viewpoints throughout the development process.

2. Need for Policy Flexibility

We are concerned about the current policy's rigidity concerning facility sizes. The existing policy does not fully reflect the evolving needs of our community. We strongly recommend conducting a thorough needs assessment to gain a clear understanding of both present and future requirements. This assessment should guide necessary policy adjustments to ensure that the facilities we plan will effectively meet our community's needs and adapt to future demands.

3. Shortage of Purpose-Built Facilities for Individuals with Disabilities

There is a significant gap in purpose-built facilities for individuals with disabilities, which are crucial for connecting socially isolated elderly individuals. The draft proposal does not fully utilize the land's potential for much-needed housing and expanded community facilities, unlike similar developments observed in other areas of London and beyond. We urge a re-evaluation of the proposal to better integrate these essential elements. Additionally, we note that privately-owned land has been secured to address future community needs, and it is important that this opportunity is leveraged to enhance the development.

4. Economic and Employment Opportunities

The site offers substantial potential for driving economic growth within the construction sector and creating local job opportunities. However, we have concerns that the proposed key route has not been sufficiently reviewed to align with the potential for housing and economic development. We recommend a detailed examination of this aspect to ensure it supports both housing and economic goals effectively.
