I went to East Ham library to get a hardy copy of the LP but I didn't found any I can take to my practice.

I have checked on line and I saw wards boundaries has changed with not justification.

For example the Manor Park Village Conservation Area is out of Manor Park in the LP to joint Forest Gate when wich has already another Conservation Area Forest Gate, increasing power of the wealthiest in Forest Gate and in-balancing démographie and diversity in Manor Park who lost the only existent conservation area in the ward.

Also my area was Manor Park with E12 with the LP lost importance e became part of East Ham with not justification at all .

Manor Park it self with the main Elisabeth Elizabeth Station became isolating in the middle of nowhere and unified with Little Ilford that is totally disconnected.

Can you please reviews boundaries? and associate for the ward line line that has not resident participation please.

Please note that the consultancy in charge of this study stated that the boundaries has been changed by residents and this has to be supervised as many residents don't participe in consulation due they are not settle of homeowners living in HMO and don't care about the LP .

For my own experince volunteering in the communities assembles one year always we have the same issue where the conversation is being dominated by few residents not all.

It is a group of resident living in the conservation area who has the power as they participate en Comunity Assemblies they are mostly enghish, wealthy and homeowners living in Manor Park Conservation Area that now has pushed to. be part of Forest Gate depriving Manor Park of the only conservation area has with not sense.

Other wards has not participation to decide or change boundaries as they are mostly vulnerable, poor, sick, disable, tenants and travellers in HMO many don't speak enghish so you can not rely only in the residents who participate as is has many other that don't have a voice for the reasons exposed above

I hope you can take my observation and do your own inquiries and see why the boundaries has changed that in my point of view is arbitrary following fonciere expeculation gain used to increase the value of already expensive properties en Forest Gate and unified with them. the wealthiest, in deprivation of already poor vulnerable areas that need to be boosted as the one I'm living and working for example.

Thank you so much for those clarifications and links that I will read with time.

Yes I would like my comments be assessed please.

For example I don't understand why I the LP proposals unified two conservation areas in Forest Gate depriving Manor Park from the only one existent and not creating any other.

I didn't see any proposal to create a Conservation Area either in Manor Park or East Ham , please let me know if I'm wrong.

I would like to understand how the place I live and work will grow as per the LP they will be in an extremity of East Ham where nothing happens except for the Green hill new affordable homes scheme That has tipping up and quite small with not shops designed there as far as I know.

In the area im I don't find any supermarkets (english kind like Tesco's, Coop et I have to travel to buy food either Wanstead, Ilfort Stratford or even churches including catholics ones.

I live in an only Asian supermarkets and restaurants ,(that I love as I'm veg) but shops and services only for men: barberries, car sales, tyres, betting shops, fast food, mosquées and temples not cafes or option for

women and girls.

Here is an area where women are invisible and dominated by one culture or two as I said above. My area is not diverse as Newham says at all, the opposite of what I though when I moved here to settle investing all our savings, is very sad almost impossible to socialised and make friends as they lives in their own groups not sharing with other who don't belong to them:-(

I wish my area became diverse where all can participate, buy their own food and with spaces to socialised or cowork, here is inexistant with high crime and deaths (Plashed Park)

The little historic asserts here not listed or are but der elected and unloved, no areas of proteccion historique despite de archeological asserts, nor proposal to included assets to be listed.

The ones we have as urban references in the area we live (using Chueca Goitia expressions) has been destroyed to create shops and venues or transformed to recreate the dominants cultures deformed the enghish heritage and no one's cares.

Here is land of relaxation and disregards of regulations as anyone do what they want (trust me as I'm a local architect) they don't care about submit planning applications and built. or develop without any worries because they know here is not monitoring and people here are most of them travellers not landlords but tenants not settled so no one reports anything.

Is quite depressing live and work here and I would like to have some hope with the LP sat least.

Copies of the Local Plan are available at all the libraries for review, however you are unable to take them home with you. The Local Plan is also available on our website here for you to download.

To clarify – the 17 neighbourhoods in the Local Plan are different from wards or community neighbourhood areas and fulfil a different purpose. The purpose of the neighbourhood areas is to provide planning policies which can apply to the whole of the neighbourhood and shape growth at a more local and detailed scale. Therefore, when considering the boundaries we analysed the different ways the borough can be sub-divided. This included administrative boundaries such as ward boundaries, planning designations including town centre boundaries or conservation areas, their character (the look and feel of an area) and their function, such as the type of uses in an area. This led to boundaries which may not align to ward boundaries for a range of reasons, for example sometimes the ward boundaries would have cut town centres or other planning designations in half, which would make developing a useable policy for the area more difficult. These boundaries are only for the Local Plan, the ward boundaries and community neighbourhood boundaries remain the same and will continue to be used for political representation purposes and for the community assemblies and people powered places projects.

These neighbourhoods have been identified through the Newham Characterisation Study (2024) and informed by public engagement. You can read more about how we developed the boundaries in <u>this chapter</u> and a summary of the consultation in <u>this chapter</u> (page 15 onwards).

The boundaries were then shaped by further public engagement during the last consultation, and you can read more about the changes which were made <u>here</u>.
