RE: Newham Local Plan Regulation 19 Consultation Response

Redbridge Council is pleased for Newham's' comprehensive and ambitious Draft Submission Newham Local Plan.

We note that our previous comments on the Draft (Regulation 18) Newham Local Plan have been considered and addressed, especially in relation to waste and burial policies. Redbridge Council is supportive of Newham's Draft Submission Local Plan and considers the Plan to be positively prepared, fulfilling Duty to Cooperate requirements, good evidence base and is effective.

Waste and utilities

We support the changes to the changes to Policies W1, W3 and W4, as it is considered that they do not affect the overall core waste policies in the Plan.

Neighbourhoods

Changes to Neighbourhood boundaries, policies, site allocations and site allocation maps have been made to in the Regulation 19 Draft Submission Newham Local Plan. We have no further comments to make on these policies beyond those made at Regulation 18 stage.

Burials

We support the publication of the Newham Burial Space Study. We expect that Newham's unmet need for new burial plots will continue to be largely met from sites on the edge of, or outside, Greater London. We would like to highlight that Redbridge will not be able to meet any of Newham's unmet need for burial plots.

Duty to Cooperate

We consider that Newham is fulfilling Duty to Cooperate requirements and is communicating with neighbouring authorities, especially regarding the East London Joint Waste Plan.

We continue to look forward to meeting with Newham officers for further discussions regarding joint strategic matters and cross-boundary issues.

Summary

Redbridge Council is supportive of the policy changes to the Draft Submission Newham Local Plan and considers Duty to Cooperate requirements to have been met.
