Our Association wish to highlight the need for more Boutique type of Hotels in Manor Park. We note that there are no such places of accommodation from Forest Gate, up until The A406 Flyover.

We would not wish to see Bread and Breakfast type Hotels, but well run and professional looking Boutique types, that integrate into the local surroundings and local scene.

We note that there is a lack of flowers and trees along the Romford Road, East and West and it looks very dry and non-appealing. Its used very widely and is very busy, so some trees and flowers would be welcome.

Provision for more parking along Romford Road would be most welcome, as many businesses feel that they suffer, due to the public not having sufficient parking to shop, at local stores. Much business is lost to Ilford and Stratford.

We have received a number of requests for an extension to the consultation period, to provide more time to respond outside of the school summer holiday period. Our consultation timing was directed by the July General Election and local by-elections and the June 2025 deadline for submission of plans under the current planning regime.

In the Government's consultation on revisions to the National Planning Policy Framework, published on the 30th July, they announced a proposed change to the submission deadline for plans to progress under the current planning regime from June 2025 to December 2026. As such, we are now in a position to extend our consultation period by 2 weeks to enable more time for consultees to provide responses beyond the summer holiday period.

The new consultation deadline is 5pm on 20th September 2024.
