London Borough of Newham – Local Plan Review – Draft Submission Local Plan Consultation (Regulation 19) – September 2024

We are instructed to submit representations on the London Borough of Newham's Draft Submission Local Plan on behalf of Stratford City Business District Limited ("SCBD Ltd") set out in this letter and the completed response form in **Appendix 1**.


SCBD Ltd is a major landowner that is the principal owner of Stratford Cross, which is located within the Stratford Metropolitan Centre boundary and currently sits within the local planning authority boundary of the London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC).

SCBD Ltd also owns the Triangle site located in a central location between the Metropolitan Centre, UCL East and Stratford Station (the "Site"), which as subsequently been incorporated into **Site Allocation N8.SA2 Stratford Station.**

The proposed land uses for the site allocation, including residential, employment uses (including office and R&D), main town centre uses and social infrastructure including, community facilities and education facilities are supported and all would be appropriate on the Site. The range of uses will allow a flexible response to markets and help ensure the development of the allocation is optimised to support the associated enhancements to Stratford Station.

The Site is located adjacent to the Metropolitan Centre and adjacent to Stratford Station and is highly accessible and a location where London Plan D3 'Optimising site capacity through the design-led approach' Part B where higher density developments should be promoted.

The Site is currently proposed within the 60m Tall Building Zone TBZ. However, its location between the 110m AoD building to the north in Stratford Cross and the 100m TBZ around the station to the northeast provides the opportunity to improve legibility of the new proposed link over the railway corridor and access to Stratford Station through a taller building up to 100m on the Site.







Furthermore, the Site has to address many site constraints, including the existing ground level set below the Montfichet Road level, railway on all three boundaries and the need to integrate with the new proposed bridge structure over the railway set out in the draft Site Allocation. All of which will add challenges to the viable delivery of the Site and necessitate the optimisation of the development and height to help achieve the wider aims of the Site Allocation in supporting the enhancements to Stratford Station.

Therefore, we recommend that the Site is included within the 100m TBZ, to help improve the legibility of the Metropolitan Centre and new proposed links to Stratford High Street and also to optimise the Site capacity to support the overall station project.

SCBD Ltd welcomes the opportunity to discuss the potential for the Sites further with the London Borough of Newham through the emerging Local Plan process.

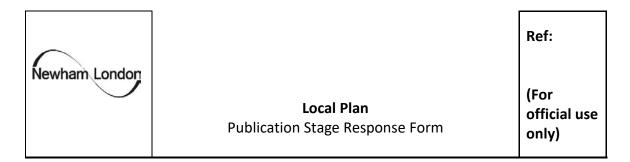


