Findings so far
September 2025



The West Ham Park experimental low traffic neighbourhood has now been live for nine months. During this time we have been collecting traffic data and engaging with residents through events and surveys to understand how the scheme affects walking, cycling and vehicle journeys; and to ultimately inform a decision as to whether to keep or remove the scheme.

- Feedback received from residents and stakeholders
- How the council has engaged with residents so far and how you can have your voice heard

The feedback survey remains live. We encourage you to share your thoughts and ideas about the experimental West Ham Park LTN. Even if you have previously submitted feedback, you can submit new or additional comments. We are keen see how your views may have evolved over the course of the scheme. The survey will remain open until the end of the statutory consultation period, and you will receive adequate notice of the survey close date once that is determined.

How the scheme has affected vehicle traffic, cycling and walking so far

Traffic data is being collected and reviewed at over 100 different locations, covering every street within the LTN and all boundary roads.

Monitoring began in November 2022, and data is being continuously collected and reviewed, giving a solid foundation of baseline data and helping show how the LTN has affected the way that people travel.



One of the key questions in our consultation survey asks residents what their sentiment towards the scheme is as. As the experimental Low Traffic Neighbourhood has settled in, views have evolved. The chart below shows the most recent response from each participant in the survey.


Key themes from our engagement so far have been:


Comments in support of the scheme identify quieter and safer streets, improved air quality, and a stronger sense of community. Residents report more walking, cycling, and overall satisfaction with the changes. Comments that are not in support of the scheme identify motor vehicle access, impacts on motor vehicle journey times and raise questions about traffic displacement.

'The LTN has improved the area in general. Walking around feels safer and improves the quality of living in the whole area.'

'Extended car journey for locals as we need to go around to get to our destination.'

To help further encourage people to walk and cycle in the West Ham Park LTN, a range of events and activities are on offer, provided by the council to ensure everyone has access to the skills and equipment required to enjoy quieter streets:



Dr Bike: Free cycle checks and repairs by a local mechanic

17 Dr Bikes held, and 191 bikes checked



Monthly bike markets: Residents can pick up affordable, serviced bikes or donate unwanted bicycles.

46 bikes sold and 33 bikes donated at 6 markets
