

## Newham Council response to IN2.1: Inspector's Further Preliminary Questions to the Council

FPQ1. (a) Could the Council provide a list of all the specified information that applicants are required to provide along with the policy and/or other part of the Plan that refer to each?

(b) What is the justification for referring to these information requirements in the Plan, rather than on a published list which the Council will review at least every two years?

## **Council Response:**

a) The requirements are summarised in the table below, alongside the key policies that explain the purpose of the requirement(s), and any further references across the Plan that are necessary for consistency of approach. The final column of the table provides an indication of how the list of requirements/assessment can be integrated into typical submission documents, such as planning statements, design and access statements, energy statements etc.

b) The requirements/assessment are set out in policy in order to aid clarity and consistency. The main policy explains the standards/principles/objectives that the requirement/assessment will demonstrate, while in other policies include cross-references to the assessment(s). We believe this aids implementation, by being clear for applicants what they are required to do and is in line with PPG Paragraph: 018 Reference ID: 26-018-20191001 on assessment frameworks being included in policy.

The requirements/assessment are included directly within the Local Plan because this provides a legally binding and transparent framework for future development, ensuring it is sound and sustainable. Publishing assessments and requirements as a separate, regularly reviewed list would be less effective, as it would not have the same legal weight as the Local Plan, could lead to inconsistencies, and would be less accessible for the long-term planning required for major development.

By embedding assessments into policies, the council gains greater consistency and discretion to respond to proposals and, in turn, can produce decisions that are more robust and less vulnerable to appeal.

FPQ2. Could the Council provide a map of the Borough showing the relevant designated centres and parades along with the specified radii / distances from each.

## **Council Response:**

Please see mapping provided in Town Centres Network Review Methodology Paper Update 2024 (EB034), Appendix 5:



- Newham's Town Centres Network: established/emerging and future 400m catchments; and
- Newham's Town Centres Network: established/emerging and future 15min walk catchments.

The mapping indicates that, once the full network is delivered, there are very minor parts of the borough that will continue to be not within 15 minutes walking distance of at least two designated centres or parades:

- MOL land to the east of the borough,
- the Beckton Sewage Works and industrial land at Jenkins Lane.
- A small section of existing terraced houses north of Forest Gate Town Centre.

The Council further notes that the intention of this policy is not to limit the location of residential uses, but to direct the location of main town centre uses so that the objective set out in the policy is achieved. This has also been the Council's response to a similar question raised by a developer at Regulation 18 and 19.
