2	 Co-designing a new autism support service Josune Martin from the Together Café presented: The café currently offers a crisis line or 1:1 conversations in their centre. Crisis is a self-defined term, you need to book an appointment and they can refer you on to other services if needed. The service runs 365 days a year. They don't currently offer home visits Josune wanted ideas to help them run a better service for autistic people. The ideas fed back included home visits, a quiet room at the venue, more morning appointments and appointments on a Friday and Sunday. Oliver McGowan training and Health Passports were also mentioned. Josune will convene a focus group to develop these ideas further. ACTION – Linda to share information on Health Passports. 	Linda
